The National Recovery and Resilience Plan (NRRP) provides a broad spectrum of investments and reforms for Italian ranging from Municipalities, digitization from to tourism, social governance to interventions.

#### **Changing local govenments - 2**

Guidance will be provided to local governments to implement the national cloud hub via certified servers. Part of EU-funded projects to help Italy's economy recover from the pandemic, the cloud hub initiative, reflects European efforts to make the 27-member bloc less dependent on large overseas tech companies for cloud services.



# Ministro per l'innovazione tecnologica e la transizione digitale

A central team led by the Ministry of Digital Transition will assist local governments on technical analysis phase and defining priorities; in the census of suitable suppliers for every activity of transformation. The aim is to promote «Migration packages» to the cloud and other digital services.



Minor local governments will group jointly to enact the processes of migration and digital transformation.

#### **Process simplification-2**

Special groups, composed of 1000 newly hired professionals specialized in deregulation, will fight bottlenecks inside bureaucracies. These groups will work:



- on reengineering the public administration.
   200 procedures to reform due within 2030 and 600 due within the conclusion of NRRP.

- on supporting project proposals
- on supporting monitoring and evaluation.

#### **Changes in workplace of local governments - 1**

In the scenario of the Public Administration Reform, an initiative aims to support medium-sized local administrations, provinces and municipalities, from 25,000 to 250,000 inhabitants, based on an organizational model that the EU has called "Bricks, Bytes & Behaviors".

NRRP resources will finance the first pilot projects, while European Programming 2021 - 2027 will fund remaining actions.

Reskilling, upskilling and head hunting will play a crucial role.

#### Tourism and Cultural heritage - removing barriers, enhancing efficiency - 2

Investment 2.1 involves historic towns called borghi. Italy is favouring this type of rural tourism in order to veer toward a more sustainable form of tourism, since when cities are overcrowded and human pressure is negatively affecting Italian cultural heritage. Rural tourism can also help local communities to develop, providing opportunities to young entrepreneurs.



The initiatives in rural areas will be implemented through the "National Borghi Plan", a program made to support the economic and social development of rural areas, based on the cultural regeneration of small towns to trigger new types of tourism. The actions are included in "Integrated local projects for Cultural heritage".







#### Tourism and Cultural heritage - removing barriers, enhancing efficiency - 3



Interventions include:

- recovering the historical heritage, the regeneration of open public spaces (i.e. removing architectural barriers removal or improving street furniture), providing new small cultural services for tourism;
- creating and promoting new itineraries (thematic itineraries, historical routes) and guided tours.

Financial aid will be granted to support cultural, creative and tourist activities, concerning commercial, agri-food and artisanal sectors. These actions will revive local economies, by valuing ancient craftsmanship and knowledges.







#### **Tourism and Cultural heritage: parks and gardens**



Investment 2.3 is about Programs for enhancing local identities. Policies include maintenance of parks and historic gardens.

The measure means improving life quality by valuing cultural assets, and promoting, in particular, an extensive regeneration of parks and historic gardens as drivers for promoting intangible assets, local identities and communities.

The initiative includes:

- maintenance, management and regeneration of about 5,000 historic villas, parks and gardens;
- retraining of local personnel responsible for management of gardens and villas.

#### Waste management: filling the gap - 2

NRRP's investments aim to close gaps concerning waste plant capacity and quality standards between facilities located in richer and poorer Italian regions.

The goal is to reach new standards set by the EU Commission, such as recycling 65% by 2030 and dumping in landfill no more than 10% of the overall waste national production.









#### Local government support in waste management - 1



The Italian waste chain suffers from infringement procedures started by the European Commission. Mainly in Southern Italy.

Many local governments delayed building new plants, mainly due to the lack of technical knowledge.

#### Piste ciclabili urbane e turistiche: 1.820 km in più - 2



The number of cyclists has been growing steadily since 2013.

Bikes are not polluting, biking is healthy and the bicycle economy reaches 7.6 billion users each year. With the pandemic, the number of cyclists in the 2020 has increased by 20%.

The initiative aims to facilitating and further promoting the growth of the sector through the creation and maintenance of bike lanes in urban and metropolitan areas, for everyday life or for tourism. The measure also has the purpose of improving social cohesion at national level, with 50% of the resources allocated to the Regions of Southern Italy.









#### Beyond private car: rapid mass mobility - 1

Mission 2 - Component 2.4 - Investment 4.2 is about development a quick mass transport system

The initiative provides the construction of 240 km of network equipped for mass rapid transport infrastructures such as metro (11 km), trams (85 km), trolleybuses (120 km), cable cars (15 km).

### Beyond private car: rapid mass mobility - 2



Private cars are the most popular type of transport in Italy. In 2019, out of 36 million people over 18, 2 out of 3 people drove a car every day. The use of cars in total trips is over 60%, while the use of public transport systems is only 10%.

This involves pollution and traffic jams. The focus of the initiative will be mainly on metropolitan areas.

The goal is to shift at least 10% of private traffic to public transport.







#### **Eletric cars and chargin stations - 1**

Mission 2 - Component 2.4 -Investment 4.3 is about spreading and developing plugin electric vehicle charging stations.

The intervention aims at locating 7,500 fast charging points on the motorway and 13,755 in urban centers. Furthermore, 100 energy experimental charging stations with energy storage will be enacted.

#### **Eletric cars and chargin stations - 2**



The development of electric mobility represents a significant opportunity for decarbonisation of the sector, but to date it is very limited and accounts for 0.1% of the total number of vehicles.

To achieve the European objectives on decarbonisation, a 6 million electric fleet is expected by 2030. 31,500 charging stations must be implanted.

#### Integrated urban plans: the third sector - 1

Planning can bring together core/leading and peripheral Municipalities, in order to mend and revamp underprivileged areas, filling infrastructural and mobility gaps, triggering economic convergence.

The interventions can be co-planned with the Third Sector, co-financed by private donors up to 30% and funded directly by European Investments Bank.









#### **Integrated urban plans: the third sector - 2**

Primary objectives are urban regeneration, improving life quality, nurturing participation and entrepreneurial engagement. The projects will restore local identities through the promotion of social, cultural and economic activities, with a specific focus on environmental policies.









#### Integrated urban plans: fighting illegal hiring

Policies include slum clearance in urban and rural contexts, and fight against illegal employment, according to the National Strategy dedicated to this issue. More labour inspectors will be hired.
